"Mosaic Clouds" is an exhibition of works by artists from Tutti Ensemble's Visual Arts and Design program, where the emphasis is on strength rather than disability. The program is vibrant and encourages participants to practice as serious and committed artists. Areas of work include 2D and 3D mediums and also an exciting new Digi-Tech program.

The works have been produced over the last 6 months and reflect each

artist's pursuit of individual interest areas & skills. These include abstract paintings of intricate grid structures aglow with colour; mosaic-like pattern paintings; motifs from the natural world - flowers, insects, animals, fish; portraits & images depicting fanciful, imaginative worlds and creatures.

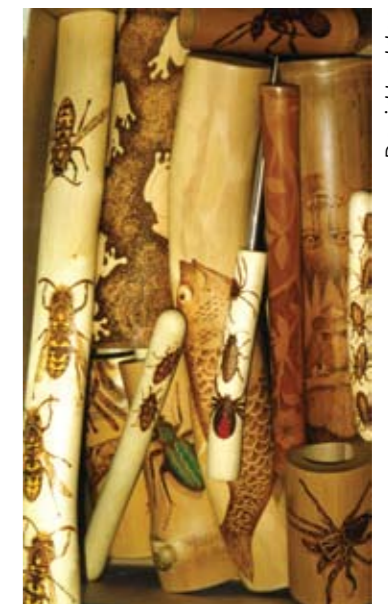

Artist of the Month June

6 - 28 June
Margaret Harris - Weaver



"My 20 year love of weaving began when I joined TAFE to learn the craft of spinning. On seeing weaving being demonstrated, I found myself hooked & have never looked back!

I tackled a woollen coat as my first article. The success of that resulted in wool being my primary medium for a period of time creating scarves, wall hangings, throws – and even dining room chair covers!

From a visit to Thailand I diversified. Discovering raw silk in the villages, I began to dye the beautiful yarns weaving more exotic wall hangings and framed pictures.

Further travels to the UK and Europe enabled me to attend a live-in workshop in Wales. This instruction with artist Martin Weatherhead further expanded my experience into using other fibres including cotton and linen yarn. Rag rugs became my favourite woven articles!

Continuing to weave in silk, wool, cotton & rag, I have most recently concentrated on a range of Rag Rugs as a conscious expression of our need to recycle. Sometimes I go back to my shelves and use other beautiful yarns too - all about finding a balance!

I hope you enjoy my range of work..."

Artist of the Month July

6 - 26 July
Halyna Zalotockyj - Textiles



"Under the 'Nina & Bess' label, I work with vintage Japanese pure silk recycled from traditional kimonos and accessories. Calling on my background both as a Japanese teacher, & as a textiles and design artist my work to date has included all kinds of bags, cushions, belts, lavender bags & cushions, table runners and silk 'button' jewellery.

My aim is to honour the spirit of the kimono – the exquisite detailing, careful hand-sewing, & traditional weaving / dying techniques. For example the 'obi butterfly cushions' pay homage to the original purpose of the fabric with the 'butterfly' shape mimicking the traditional appearance of the Kimono belt. Though heavily influenced by the Japanese aesthetic, all my designs are originals.

I also make all of the inserts to my cushions using colourful Japanese cottons in traditional patterns so that, as in traditional custom, often the brightest section is that which is hidden, or only partly revealed.

Also displayed are my own lino-block prints on linen, and crafted into bags. These are based on Japanese 'kamon' or family crests.
