Jorji Gardener - Printmaking

"Varie Tea - the Spice of Life" is my collection of work in which I have played with the way words, language and meaning can be shaped and also distorted.

These whimsical creations have been developed over several years and many cups of tea, and are something of a change from the usual 2D work of printmaking.

As with real tea bags, each of these handmade bags contains an essence, 'qualitea' or state of mind! "Mobilitea" is my first ever instillation and is designed to tickle your funny Tea bone!

My background in landscape design and horticulture continues to influence my work as well as being inspired by patterns of nature and Eastern Arts.

I fell in love with lino carving while studying Printmaking in NSW and have been fortunate also to have studied in Adelaide with the inspirational Dianne Longley. Mostly I use the multi-block printing method despite and because of its challenges!

For my bread and butter I have a small business making high quality hand-made cards while dreaming of more time for printmaking.

Hans Fander - Woodwork
1-26 September



"Growing up in China as I did, one is surrounded by craftspeople and artisans of all kinds as well as temples, palaces and all manner of creations showing wonderful artistry in a wide range of media.

As a boy, I, like many of my contemporaries, became involved in model aeroplanes (those were the days!) This later turned into model ship building working with those small pieces of wood and shapes.

My professional career as a geologist and mineralogist also had a creative outlet. Motivated by my parents who were both keen photographers it is certainly true that a picture is worth a thousand words!

My interest in wood was sustained from my childhood however, particularly wood carving, which eventually (very eventually!) resulted in a focus on wood turning. I continue to thrive on this work, which has been a part of my life on and off for the past 10-15 years.

My interest in enamelling ultimately stems from the beautiful cloisonné creations I admired in China, and I have tried to incorporate enamels with my wood turned pieces, to be just a little different.

I hope you find enjoyment in my work."
