"Hi I'm Jen Greeneklee and welcome to my art world.

I am a local Artist with an eclectic range of genre's using graphic, abstract and stylized forms.

My main medium is clay, with some glass.

Hand construction works best for me giving each piece a UNIQUE, INDIVIDUAL ambience.

I implement this paradigm in my finished jewellery as ALL the Ceramic and Glass beads are MADE BY ME, thus giving each piece the AUTHENTICITY of being HANDMADE.

I enjoy bringing the whimsical to my work, seen in the decorative influences on my platters, coasters, and beads. I also extend myself to others through tuition and my own shop, thereby sharing the enjoyment of what I do as widely as possible. Creative party ideas also work well!

I hope you will enjoy viewing my work as much as I have creating it.

I express my range through a label: 'Jen-e-sais-quoi'

This is a play on my name and the French word Je-ne-sais-quoi (pronounced 'je-ner-say-qua') which means 'an indescribable attractive attribute or quality'; 'a certain something'.

"Our 10-year pursuit began from humble beginnings making jewellery together as a hobby. From using beading cotton and seed beads, we have progressed in some wonderful new directions ever since.

Along the way we relocated to the small railway town of Peterborough – just 2 years ago. Missing Adelaide and its activity our hobby has kept us sane... and we have continued to flourish.

Murano beads, lamp work and Swarovski crystal are now almost exclusively our choice of materials. Having fallen in love with Murano jewellery (also known as Venetian glass) while on holidays it became our dream to be able to work with those beautiful beads!

While it took some time to source the beads we needed from reputable and reliable suppliers, and to source the sterling and gold fill finding to finish off each piece, it was well worth the effort. Beads are such joyful things to work with and every piece is made with love.

And so, as you view our work and consider taking a piece home, please think of the two of us sitting happily at our kitchen table, far from our humble start, but close to the essence of this wonderful craft."
