**Margaret Wollaston,
Ceramics**



"I have been working in the clay medium for many many years, having been introduced to the medium originally when I was a student of Architecture. From a career as an architect, plus mother and wife, I took on the new challenge of studying ceramics at the SA School of Art.

Many workshops with leading Australian and international potters have influenced my work and I have enjoyed exhibiting throughout Australia since 1977. Internationally I had four pieces of work selected for the Austrade Display in Tokyo plus another large consignment to New York.

A very large body of work was commissioned for the then named United Water Corporation in Adelaide, with my inspiration taken from Australia's unique landscape, earthy and ochre tones, as well as the blues of water, created into sculpted water vessels.

In addition I have been involved as convenor for many exhibitions and acted as President for various local potters clubs.

This display will likely be my 'finale' at Pepper Street in anticipation of an interstate move to live closer to my children and grandchildren.

My art has been a pleasure and a passion."

"I make artworks that stylistically reflect the exquisiteness of the natural world. My art pays homage to precious and unusual flowers, native birds and insects, that I find on my explorations.

I aspire to illuminate the delicacy of nature by delving into the details, observing and crafting tiny anatomical patterns. I use hand engraving, punching, cold forming and hammering to bring my jewellery to life, often described as complex and detailed on a minute scale, like nature itself.

Each little hand made treasure is a physical manifestation of my exploration into how to lead a happy, purposeful and meaningful life. I use shapes, patterns and motifs as a vehicle to express my personal enquiries and reflections about life.

Stylish, elegant, sophisticated and minimal, are words used by others to describe my work, which I create in my home based studio, being limited edition pieces to last you a life time.
