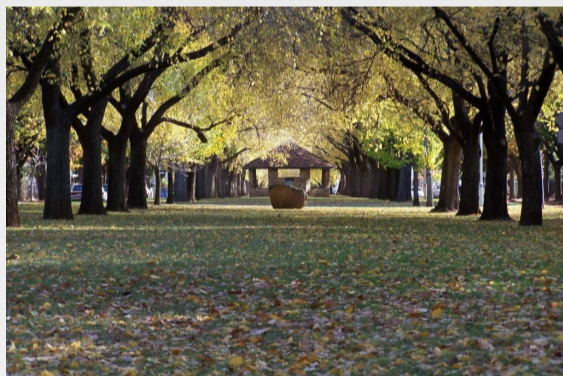
Conyngam Street Dog Park

Two new drinking fountains with dog water bowls will be provided, as well as a new shade shelter with seats and table. 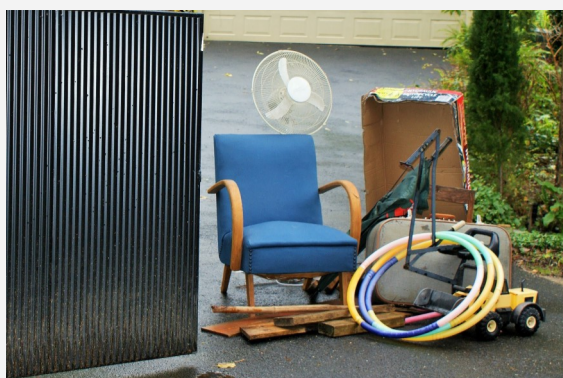
Swimming Centre works

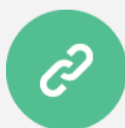
