
Talk and Textiles Group

"In my life I have had many jobs, but it was the life of a professional artist that I was aiming for, realised only once I had settled in Australia after moving here from Russia with my family. I finally had the opportunity to make my dream come true - to learn how to draw and paint professionally.

Several happy years were spent studving at Marden Senior College where I was exposed to so much more than my initial interest in drawing and painting. By graduation in 2015 I had become interested in a range of styles and techniques, the use of different tools and materials, and overall a wider view on how I wanted to develop my arts practice. Combining what I had learned in unusual ways became my direction. My most favourite is mixed media and three-dimensional collage using ink and pen, fine liners, acrylics and watercolours, fabric and natural materials.


On show are some of my favourite collages, created using a variety of techniques and materials, which I hope you will enjoy."
