

Throughout this year, students in Years 8 to 12 have been creating works in Art, Design and Media using a range of subjects as inspiration. Many of the students have attended workshops, exhibitions or had guest presenters, who are professionals in their industry, to guide students in the creation of their works, developing a range of new techniques and adding to the quality of the work they present. Senior students have also produced pieces from workshops they have attended in collaboration with the Art Gallery of South Australia.

Students have used a range of mediums including painting, mixed media, sculpture, digital media, design and multimodal works, working under the broad theme of *Ignite Imagination* to help guide their personal visual aesthetic, creating a variety of works that are unique, moving and demonstrate their skills as budding artists or designers.

Students have created works interpreting the broad theme of *Ignite Imagination*, whether it is their through own personal identity, relationships or links to the environment. Adolescents are at a stage where they are becoming more self-aware and form their own identity, so this is an ideal time to be inspired and allow their imaginations to run wild.

Ignite Imagination has allowed NMHS students to explore how they relate to themselves, contemporary culture and the world through passion and a personal creative journey. At school, the students develop a passion for the arts and are encouraged to develop their creativity and critical thinking. October Kristin Wohlers Mosaic Jewellery

"I live in the Barossa Valley but have been very fortunate to exhibit and sell my mosaics both Australia-wide and internationally.

The influences on my work include the use of landscape and repurposed materials. For example, re-seeded olive trees, although considered a weed, provide wonderful opportunities through the beauty and tactility of their wood. This led to the development of a series of high quality mosaic jewellery and smaller art pieces which have been well received. I also like to find new twists in the way I use classic mosaic materials to stamp each new artwork with my own style.

I have the pleasure of being exposed to many great mosaic artists through my work as the South Australian representative of the Mosaic Association of Australia and New Zealand (MAANZ). During my artist of the month display you too can expand your experience of mosaic art through our latest exhibition *Flow*, being held at Pepper Street during October."





November Eliza Piro Textiles



Bold, spirited and beautiful, Eliza Piro's paintings are a celebration of colour and of life itself. Comprising an array of vibrant colours and patterns, Eliza's paintings evoke feelings of optimism and joy.

"Working in acrylic paint and watercolour, I work by adorning my canvases with intricate patterns and motifs, which I liken to how an embroiderer would a tapestry. My process combines dot and linework along with layering and masking techniques, resulting in artworks that have been described by others as 'rich in colour and detail'. I hope you will see my range and decide for yourself!

Drawing inspiration from Suzani textiles, Indian mandalas and eastern folk art, my paintings acknowledge elements of spirituality and tradition, but I also aim to maintain a distinctly contemporary edge.

Recently I have developed my practice further, exploring the domestic and figurative themes of still life while maintaining the reoccurring elements of all my work, such as the use of patterning.

My recent paintings depict elaborate table settings and richly decorated interiors, evoking a sense of festivity and enjoyment in everyday life. I attempt to take ordinary snapshots of life and make them fun.

Art that lifts people's spirit and makes them feel inspired is my overarching aim, celebrating the beauty and optimism that I see and feel when I create".
