REMAKE celebrates the inventiveness and resourcefulness of the creative and artistic mind.

This high quality exhibition brings to life the phrase 'everything old is new again'. Working within the theme of recycling, upcycling, reusing, and repurposing, over 40 artists have viewed the world around them with fresh eyes and created exciting new works of art. Using discarded everyday and found objects, as well as taking inspiration from what we might normally regard as junk or garbage, the results are amazing.

The artwork encourages us to consider our impact on the environment by bringing a little creativity into how we can prevent everyday items from being sent to landfill. There is a diverse and eclectic collection including a vast array of jewellery, wall art, sculpture, glass and textiles. Some artists have worked from within their preferred specialist mediums, while others have moved into previously unexplored areas.

This highlights the importance of environmental conservation and sustainability.

'Fragmented' adjective: existing or functioning as though broken into separate parts, disorganised or disunified.

Fragmented is an exhibition that brings together South Australian textile artists from the Fibre Artist Network, a group that have been working together for over twenty years. Artists have worked individually to interpret the theme, creating imaginative, diverse and original pieces of art. To provide cohesion the artists have produced art works measuring one metre in height and up to one metre wide.

Artwork will include wall hangings or stretched canvasses and involves techniques such as embellishments, printing, dyeing, painting, fabric collage, machine and hand stitching, as well as fabric manipulation or distortion.

Artists of the Month

August

Christine Byrne Glass



'I am a fused glass and jewellery artisan dividing my time between two homes - the urban and eclectic San Francisco Bay Area and the endlessly beautiful Adelaide Hills. My work explores the development of natural complexity and depth by the multi-step layering and forming of one-dimensional materials like glass and wire. I endorse the Aesthetic Movement sentiment "...have nothing in your home that you do not know to be useful or believe to be beautiful." And ideally, both.

My formal education is in Zoology and Ecology. As a largely self-taught artist, my creative practice has spanned 25 years, beginning with copper foil and lead came stained glass, and now my new passion for warm or 'fused' glass. I am particularly drawn to reactive glass, in which the internal chemistries of the cold glass combine to generate organic changes during the fusing process. This process satisfies my inner naturalist, whilst also employing old scientific skills.

Cold work is extensively used in my fused glass. I refine and hand-polish my work to achieve the perfect edge. Blanks are returned to the kiln to be formed into simply elegant bowls and platters, and carefully annealed for strength and durability.

I strive for work that can delight displayed on a wall or tabletop, or serve to hold a week's fresh fruit or a sumptuous cheese platter. My hand-poured working glass is strongly influenced by the shapes and colours of my Australian home and garden.'

September

Vicki Bartel Mandala Art

'Based in Adelaide, I have been painting for ten years, creating work that is reminiscent of fractal and mandala patterns. The geometric forms portrayed in my work perfectly fuse art, design and mathematics, creating a mesmerising visual effect.

By using fractal and the mandala as inspiration, it provides an endless array of ideas, patterns and colour to explore in my art practice. I aim to transport my viewers beyond the ordinary pace of everyday life.

When planning each artwork, the creative process is quite structural and mathematical. This process not only balances my analytical nature and artistic aspirations but it also highlights my preoccupation with construction and minute detail.

The colour palettes featured in my paintings are the result of both experimentation and intuition where each hue, tone and shade is considered, as it will impact the overall composition.'

\$2 includes a cup of tea.


