

This exhibition showcases the artistic interpretation of the concept of 'inside, outside', a theme which provides a rich scope for the artists who form Ingroup: Hannah Bushaway, Sue Colyer, Rae Kempe and Helen Sidoryn. The members of Ingroup met during a short course at the Adelaide Central School of Art and

come from diverse backgrounds in art and education. They have met on a weekly basis for the past five years in an effort to continue their own practice and to encourage, critique and learn from each other.

Working on paper, board and canvas in a broad range of styles including realism, abstraction and expressionism, each artist has interpreted the theme in her own unique way, thereby providing contrast and interest throughout the exhibition. The theme of 'inside, outside' sprung from the artists' discussion of their own inspiration and approach to visual expression. This included a variety of differing perspectives of tangible objects, life experiences and attitudes unique to each member. Where some artists use colour to express emotion, others use details of line and shape to highlight nature's complexities and focus on current issues. All of the work featured has been drawn from either 'inside' or 'outside' of the artist. with inspiration springing from their inner worlds and emotions or the exterior world that surrounds them.

"Through creative parents I was introduced to many different artforms including drawing, painting and textiles. It was four years ago however that I discovered and fell in love with jewellery making.

Chain maille pieces are my main focus, incorporating a variety of styles and metals. You will find in my works sterling silver, stainless steel, niobium, aluminium, brass, bronze, copper and also EPDM (rubber). All the metals used are solid, not plated, including clasps and ear hooks. The use of beads and other embellishments brings another point of interest into the works, which span across a wide range of choice. Beads are glass (usually Japanese or Czech), stone, Swarovski crystal, stainless steel and sterling silver.

I derive equal pleasure out of creating necklaces, bracelets, earrings, rings and pendants, as well as sculptural pieces, purses, and those using recycled items or 'upcycling'. A number of pieces can be described as 'wearable art' and are guite complex in the patterning seen through the 'movement' of the chain maille designs.

I hope you enjoy my display."

July **Knit and Natter** (Not Just Knitting)

Knit and Natter has many purposes, having come about several years ago in answer to growing interest from the local community for a place where textiles arts and a range of crafts could be shared, explored and new ones experienced. The longer group name of 'Not Just Knitting' reflects the diversity of skill sharing which occurs, knitting being just one.

Meeting fortnightly in an informal and relaxed environment there is no membership requirement nor expectation to participate at every session. Today the group can be said to have a core of 'regulars', with a volunteer facilitator and a welcoming ambience for newcomers, or for those who like to move in and out as life allows. A small casual entry fee to support use of the workshop space and core materials for group or individual projects is collected on entry.

Participants are varied in their skill levels, from complete beginners to experts in their fields. Just some of the craft skill sharing sessions have included fabric dyeing, rag rug making, felting, knitting, stitching and from time to time talks from seasoned practising artists of interest.

The aim of the group is to share our skills and to experience new ones. A polished 'end product' is not a particular focus but for those who wish to 'finish' a skill this showcase provides a way to celebrate the process. We invite others to join us any fortnight.
