# **Annual Community Survey**

The results of this statistically valid survey show that the City of Burnside community is generally satisfied with all aspects of Council's work and that satisfactions levels are steadily growing.

In November 2015 the survey recorded an average (mean) overall satisfaction score of 7.2 out of 10, increasing from the February 2015 result of 7.1, the 2014 result of 6.9 and significantly higher than the 2013 result of 6.7.

In the November survey the community was asked their opinion on three strategic questions:

- Do they support 40 km/h speed zone on Burnside streets? - 68 per cent said 'no'
- Would they like an Open Air Cinema in the summer? - 85 per cent said 'yes'
   And is Hazelwood Park a good location? - 95 per cent said yes
- 3. Are they considering volunteering in the next 12 months? 24 per cent said 'yes' that they are.


