



Lowest Rate Rise in 10 Years!

At Tuesday's meeting Council voted to endorse the 2016/17 Draft Annual Business Plan and Budget to go to community consultation.

One of the key components of the Draft is for Council to adopt a rates rise of 0.9 per cent in line with the Local Government Price Index.

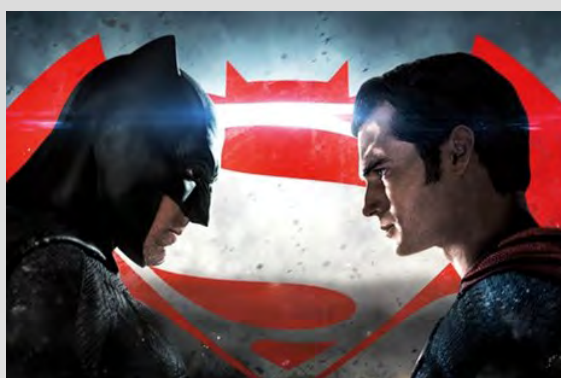
This is the lowest increase in more than 10 years and considerably lower than last year's rise of 2.9 per cent.

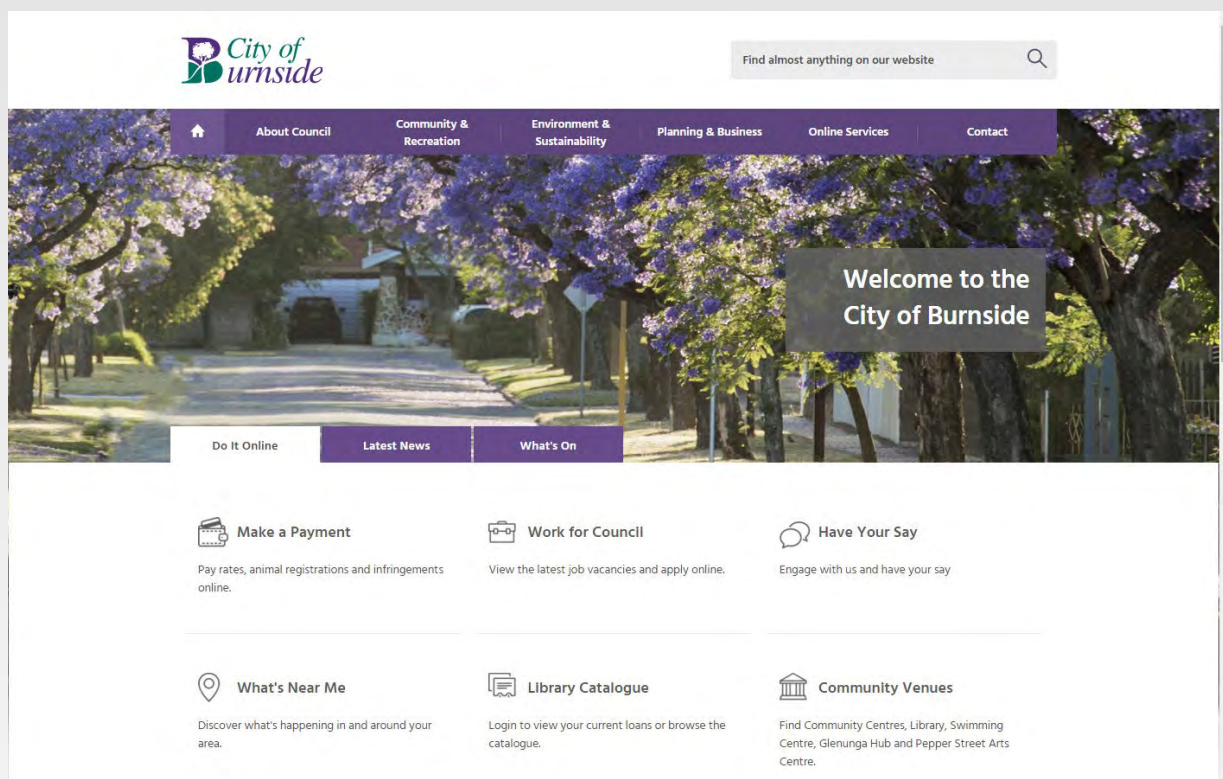
An Officer from the arboriculture department will then inspect the proposed location to determine if it is suitable for a new tree and communicate with the resident at that point.

Burnside Community Centre is thrilled to again host the Rose Society of SA's Autumn Rose Show.

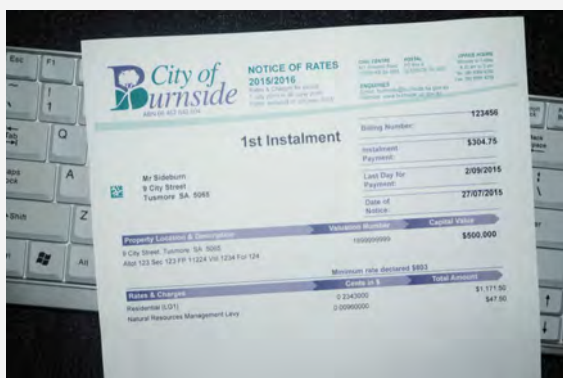

There Is No Future Without The Past

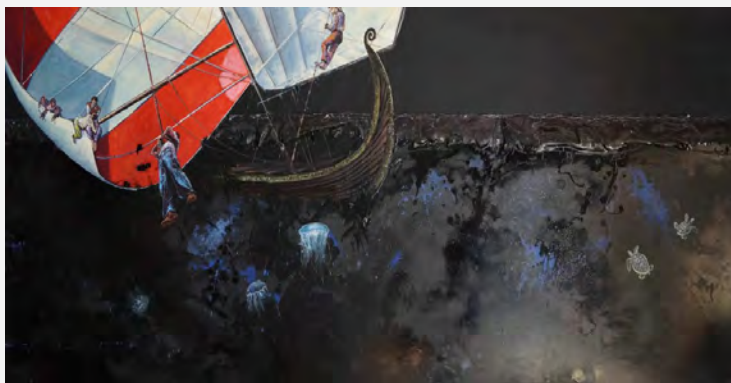
An exhibition of paintings by Master Italian Painter Domenico Palombo.
