The South Australian section of the Mosaic Association of Australia and New Zealand (MAANZ) is presenting a wide variety of wall pieces, sculptures and jewellery made by mosaic enthusiasts and professionals. Many of the artworks showcase a number of different techniques and choice of materials, such as stone, repurposed glass, ceramic tiles, smalti and cinca, that are used in this ancient art form.

Mosaics are one of the oldest art forms in the world with some mosaics still being made with similar techniques as those made 2000 years ago. Mosaics are still present in day-to-day life - in and on public buildings, in the entrances of some shops, as artworks in galleries and as custom made commissions.

Mosaics are very durable and lasting artworks and can be displayed indoors as well as outdoors. Some of the materials used such as stone, marble, glass and tile withstand the harsh weather and stress of time, especially in Australia and New Zealand. On the other hand quite nontraditional materials can be used for ephemeral mosaics for example food, leaves and other plant material or permanent installation from Lego, computer chips, lids and all kinds of other materials. The mosaic artist community is pushing the boundaries and are developing new concepts.

Throughout this year, students in Years 8 to 12 have been creating works in Art, Design and Media using a range of subjects as inspiration. By analysing the works from historical and contemporary artists, film makers and designers students have shown their creativity when applying practitioner's techniques within their own artistic vision. Many of the students have attended workshops, exhibitions or had guest presenters, who are professionals in their industry, to guide students in the creation of their works, developing a range of new techniques and adding to the quality of the work they present. Senior students have also produced pieces from workshops they have attended at the Adelaide Central School of Art and the Art Gallery of South Australia. Students have used a range of mediums including

painting, mixed media, sculpture, digital media, design and multimodal works, working under the broad theme of 'Connections' to help guide their personal visual aesthetic, creating a variety of works that are unique, moving and demonstrate their skills as budding artists or designers.

Students have created works interpreting the broad theme of Connections whether it is their own personal identity, intercultural relationships or links to the environment. Adolescents are at a stage where they are becoming more self-aware and form their own identity, so this is an ideal time to study Connections as they explore how they relate to themselves, contemporary culture and the world. At Norwood Morialta High School, students develop a passion for the Arts and are encouraged to develop their creativity and critical thinking. The exhibition provides students with an opportunity to develop their creativity in tangible ways and form connections with the Arts community allowing students to flourish as they enter a world of great change.

Michael Kayser Woodwork

"I was born in Germany and began my apprenticeship in Toolmaking at the age of 14. In 1983 I immigrated to Australia and have worked as a Toolmaker since then, to the present day. I became an Australian Citizen in 1989 and I like to say I am "an Australian - made in Germany!"

Following a cycling accident, I began working with wood to compensate for my inability to participate in cycling. Initially I produced pens, taking pride in producing a high-quality finish. As my self-taught skills and knowledge have improved, I have begun creating bowls, plates and more recently, free-form pieces.

Working with wood gives me immense satisfaction as I endeavour to accentuate the natural power and beauty of each unique piece. I take my time becoming familiar with the grain and character of the wood, be it stylish, peaceful, curious or dramatic. The final finish is achieved through many hours of patient work. It is, after all, a labour of love!"

Mario Niesingh Ceramics



We all are in transit from one place to another and it is in between these two states that we tell our story.

"I am a self-taught ceramicist and like to use experimentation as fundamental and essential to my art practice. Over the past four years I have developed several unique techniques which have come from the failures and successes of this process.

My influences include Australian fauna and flora to which I have been a committed conservationist my entire adult life, following my immigration from Holland as a child. Nature's secrets are incredibly inspiring and bountiful. When used as inspiration for a 3D medium the results are rich and varied.

I find porcelain clay offers a versatility of detail and transparency through which I can communicate. Porcelain evolves from an interactive process of metamorphic change. The medium itself is intimate in nature as the artist creates a sequence of change. Particles of sand and earth create a relationship between potter and clay that are fragments of time.

I hope to see you at my demonstration."
