During June come and see our pop-up show with a wintery vibe to celebrate the re-opening of the Centre.

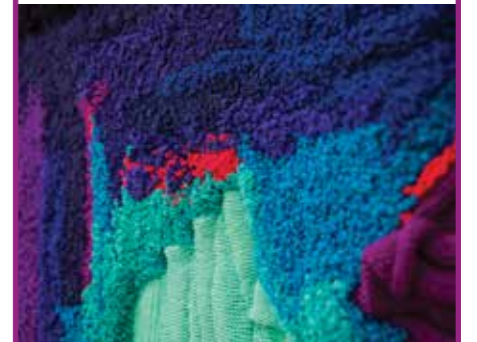

Online Artist Sharings

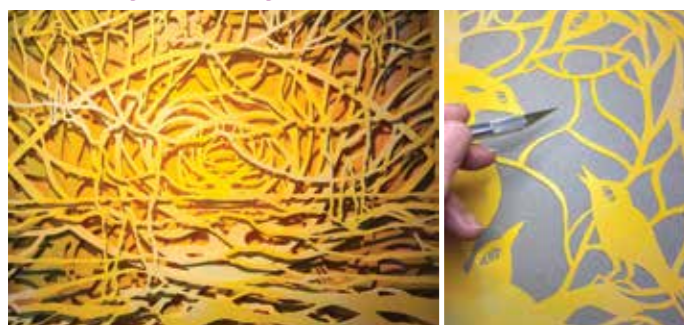
During our closure we have had the pleasure of artists sharing some of the works they have been developing. A selection of these is below and also profiled over recent weeks on our social media pages.

Alana Preece



Alana has been busy pursuing ideas which she says have been "in her head for years, in ceramics. This has resulted in a lot of research, many tests and some spectacular failures! It has and continues to be a very steep learning curve and I am only heartened by reminding myself of Thomas Edison who made 99 light bulbs before he made one that worked!" This piece is entitled Interleaved and it is unfired porcelain paper clay. She works in a number of mediums including pastel, painting, mosaics, ceramics, jewellery and textiles.

Audrey has been a regular exhibitor at Pepper Street, as well as a valued member of the volunteer team who support the Centre. Audrey is currently working on a new series of intricate paper-cut artworks, which are created by hand cutting paper and then layering pieces together to form a highly detailed image. Wilma Bajka Van Velze Weaving



"When I first began my journey into the world of weaving, I could not have imagined how important this art form would become in my life.

Not only food for the soul, it has helped me through some very difficult times - its tactile and rhythmic, sometimes meditative action of the weaving process, being quite therapeutic.

Playing with colours is most pleasurable and also combinations are endless.

With a simple weave it is the colours combined with the differently textured yarns which do the talking!

I enjoy creating a range of items including a winter range of woolen beanies, scarves and wraps, as well as a lighter range for summer using silk wools with a looser weave for the scarves and evening wraps."
