Cheryl Rogers
Glass Mosaic



"My first introduction to mosaic was in 2016. I quickly became addicted to this fascinating artform, creating over 200 works since! I did use ceramics for a time, but find much more pleasing results with the use of glass as my primary mosaic medium.

My subject matter takes inspiration from a number of sources, but my primary interest comes largely from nature. In particular I favour creating works inspired by birds of different varieties.

Other types of mosaic that I explore use mirror and multimedia. One set I call my 'Fantasy Phase', while other works are inspired by the Masters such as Vincent Van Gogh.

I have had a number of solo exhibitions in various galleries, as well as accepting several commissions over the years."

Printed Linocuts

"My art practice has evolved over the last 35 years. Always drawn to visual art as a means of expression, I have come to understand the power of images as a means of communicating ideas between people. My Bachelor of Visual Art (2001) majored in painting, drawing and printmaking.

I have enjoyed being exhibited widely in South Australia, and now embrace a range of techniques. I enjoy the challenge of representing ideas through various media, including textiles, painting, printmaking, and sculpture.

My artist of the month showcase focuses on the technique of printed linocut. Each print is hand-carved and individually hand-coloured, making each image unique.

Many hours go into the planning and careful carving of the lino block, which is then printed through a press and coloured using acrylic inks. You may not be aware that artists working in this medium need to think in reverse, as the final image is a mirror of the original block. Each new work is an exercise in patience and requires a steady hand.
