There is extraordinary diversity in the cultures of South East Asia. In particular Vietnam and Myanmar (Burma) reflect the full palette of human experience - hardship, aspirations, poverty, spiritual life and family. Their cultures are shaped by

their ancient heritage, years of conflict, and profound political and social change. Somehow the world seems more alive in a market in Vietnam or the Shwedagon complex in Myanmar."

SALA Subsidy

The City of Burnside is offering artists a SALA fee subsidy for the first time in 2015/2016.

This scheme acknowledges the role that artists and local venues play in the cultural life of the council area. Subsidies of up to \$110 are available to assist individuals and groups with the cost of registering for the SALA Festival. Eligibility criteria includes resident artists of the City of Burnside who are exhibiting either in or outside of the Council area, and artists who exhibit within the City of Burnside.

In both instances the subsidy applies only to individuals and groups who are required to pay a SALA fee direct to SALA (eg does not include exhibitions in venues which pay the SALA fee on the artist's behalf). Burnside Civic Centre Atrium Program

An artist-run program of displays by community groups, schools, organisations and other resident artists is held in the Burnside Civic Centre Atrium, an adjunct to the full Pepper Street Arts Centre program. Limited places are available in 2016. Due to the position of the display area, high visibility of the showcasing groups and individuals is enjoyed, as large numbers of visitors pass through in their daily interactions with the other programs and services of Council.
