Textile Art Works by Graduates of the Certificate IV in Textile Arts, Marden Senior College.

Offering an eclectic mix of textile artworks in this exhibition are graduates of the inaugural Marden Senior College Cert IV in Textile Arts.

The theme "Out of Line" is a deliberate play on words. Many of the students are particularly interested in expanding the boundaries of textile art beyond the conventional realm of "The Gentle Arts" – eg sewing, dressmaking, patchwork, quilting, embroidery, appliqué, etc.

The breadth of styles and techniques include felt making, historic costumes – some with a contemporary twist – naturally dyed fabrics from local native plants, photo transfer techniques combined with traditional & contemporary stitch, fabric collages, installations, contemporary abstract wall hangings, & traditional quilting methods with contemporary themes.

Out of Line will be opened by Suzanne Gummow, Visual Arts Educator and Artist, on Friday 28 March at 6pm.

"My interest in art began from a young age. This desire to be creative in my life has developed into my living and working in a world of glass, beads, jewellery and textiles. As a founding member of the S.A. Glass Bead Artists, and having been published in the Australian Glass Bead Makers' Guild Calendar over two years, I have enjoyed the response of the community to my work.

Recently my work has centred around lampworking, which is the creation of hand made glass beads. This focus has developed over time from some exciting studies with well known lampworking artists and through coursework at Uni SA as part of my Bachelor of Visual Arts specialisation. These studies also included metalsmithing & glass blowing, the skills of both I now draw on in my work.

Inspiration I take from the beauty and fragility of the natural landscape, as well as from my interest in world issues and animals. Be it a body of work, or a commissioned piece, the backyard studio in which I work is where I love to create these one off designs with a professional finish.

Enjoy a trip back in time ...

"It was during the war that my involvement with fabrics and threads began. I wouldn't say a 'love of' at that stage as I was a 15 year old apprentice "order dressmaker" and it was a tough environment for a young girl. I can say I certainly learnt the fine craft of the trade. The love of hand creating my own pieces & appreciation of the finest of vintage fabrics and trimmings, followed years later.



Vintage Fabric Bags

The vintage component of the display (the full display includes vintage and non-vintage works) includes items which I have collected from my mother, sister and aunts (to be vintage the items are at least 50 years old). These include a very tiny child's button, Artsilk curtain pieces, Lamé, needle run lace, tating of a vintage doilie, guipure lace, singlet draw strings, real wax flowers, and a Christening gown of interest.

I hope you enjoy their transformation into the various bags, clutches & coat hangers that you will see in my display."
