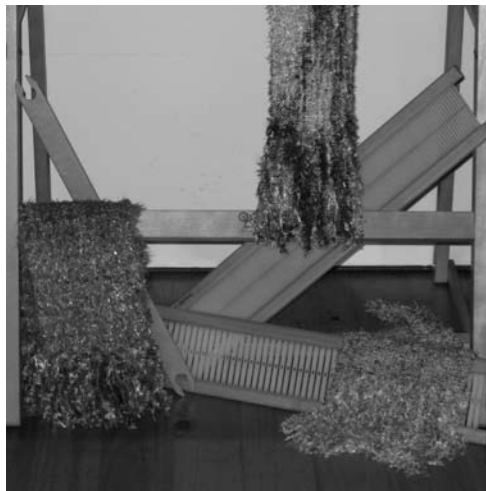

Artist of the Month August

31 July - 30 August
Gemma Sneddon - Textiles



"I've always been fascinated by textile crafts – the immediacy of the colours and textures, and the potential to make beautiful, functional objects. But as a failed child knitter, I had no idea how to create these things for myself.

When I was fifteen, I discovered weaving and I haven't looked back! Making myself a shoebox loom I started out by using scrap yarn to weave purses. Upgrading at Christmas to a full-size loom (best present ever!) I was then able to develop the weaving of scarves, shawls, bags and baby blankets.

In the five years since then, I've thrown myself into weaving with the fabulous variety of yarns available. I use a combination of wool, cotton, and synthetic yarns to create gorgeous textured fabrics with vibrant, rich colours. Softness is also a trademark of my work.

I still find it amazing that I can take these bits of fluffy string and turn them into fabric. And thanks to my yarn obsession, I've even learned to knit!"

Claire Richards - Illustration



"I am a young Adelaide artist who loves painting cheerful pictures and stories. It was during my Visual Arts studies that I really found the niche in which I love to work, developing a colourful childlike style, combining text and images.

Art is my full time occupation. I illustrate children's books, design cards and exhibit paintings. I like to celebrate the joys of being a kid in my paintings, like riding a bike or talking to pets or imaginary friends. My most recent show "How to Eat Ice Cream" depicted humorous childhood memories.

Painting children's portraits in a summer market environment is a great source of inspiration for my work. They often give me painting tips too!

Little expressions like 'You are the best thing since sliced bread' I particularly like using in my range of cards as unusual terms of endearment messages with an illustration to match.

My illustrations can be seen in *A Little Bit* by Christine and Peter Maniati and *The Eleventh Sheep* by Kyle Mewburn. Stay tuned for *Goldilocks and the Three Koalas* next! I hope you enjoy my display."

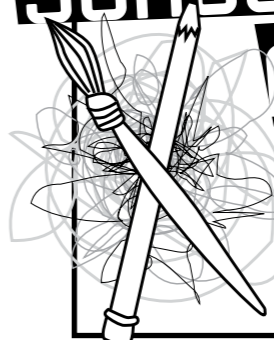
