Artist of the Month February

Christine Beck - Jewellery & Nuno Felt
2-27 February



"I am an accidental artist.

It all started eight years ago when a friend lured me to the Marden Senior College to join her in a textile art course. The rest is history!

I graduated with Certificate IV in Textile Art and Contemporary Craft, specializing in nuno felt, and along the way I also fell in love with hot glass bead making, about three years ago.

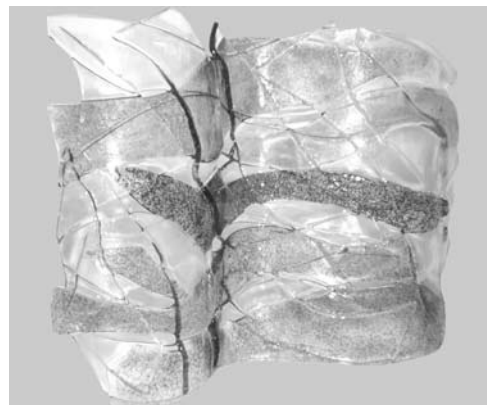
The two mediums may seem worlds apart, but not for me. I feel the flow of colours and the hands-on work produces something that has been buried deep inside me. I have been a traditional embroiderer and bobbin lace maker for many years, and in the early '90s I did leadlight, but these were only forerunners to the work I now prefer to do, and what I feel that I have achieved.

Melting glass and pulling it into new and exciting shapes is a breath taking challenge. Creating delicate nuno felt, and designing soft and flowing jackets is richly tactile. My art is two sides to the same coin, full of possibilities and challenges.

I hope you enjoy what I am showcasing."

Artist of the Month March

Barbara Davis - Glass
2-31 March



"I was in my forties when my pathway to the glass work I now create, began.

At first, it was pottery that took my fancy. As my interest in this creative pursuit increased, I was prompted by my daughter to take the next step and enrol in a visual arts course at Uni SA. Though a bit apprehensive at first, I coped well and enjoyed every minute of the experience. During this time I discovered kiln formed glass, in which I majored and graduated in 2006.

Now I have my own workshop and spend many hours experimenting with glass in my kiln. I have been lucky enough to receive two private commissions which I really enjoy doing.

My current body of work relates to waves of energy, which not only move the ocean and create the wind, but also carry information. This information is passing by, around and through us every day, and it is the unseen nature of energy waves that interests me. I use clear glass cut in wave shapes to represent the movement of energy as they intertwine and create an uneven surface. Pieces of coloured glass are placed at random over the work, representing bits and pieces of material being tossed by the wind.

In other work I use waves of coloured with clear glass to represent the energy within the landscape. When firing I allow the glass to bend and fold at its own will to create each unique piece."
