

Lana McKenzie **Textiles** 1 June - 1 July



"My art practice involves experimenting with different mediums including painting, sculpture, mixed media collage and recently textiles. I mainly draw from nature which is my endless source of inspiration. I am particularly fascinated by Mother Nature's natural world, and concerned for the sustainability of the earth in our fast paced consumerist world.

My love for textiles has been driven by my mother's involvement with the making of garments, embroidery, crochet and knitting. Growing up in a large family with my sisters always creating garments, these memories of textiles have influenced my passion to create through the textile medium.

I have a keen interest in recycling also, with regular visits to "op shops". I now have a collection of fabric 'bits and bobs', zips, hooks, eyes and press studs which I sometimes include within my artwork. I also use tea for a natural dye effect which is fixed with the heat of the iron. The text that I use in some of my artwork is my araphic design background coming to the fore.

July: Judyth Satyn Jeweller 2 - 31 July

A practising contemporary artist and jeweller, Judyth completed a Bachelor of Visual Arts in 2008, and has been a recipient of a Helpmann Academy grant. She has exhibited in Europe, China, Australia and is currently stocked by galleries in Adelaide and Dublin.

This collection was inspired by the story of 17th Century alchemist Johann Bottger and Judyth's love of experimenting with materials. After locking herself in her tumbling down shed/studio she stumbled across a way to transform lace into silver and to fuse it magically to glass.



This unique technique creates alluring 'jewels' that are both contemporary, original and intriguing. Like treasures of a lost age.

Her artist of the month collection explores the wonders of merging contemporary practises with ancient crafts, and the romance and beauty of lace re-discovered afresh. The vibrant glass becomes the colourful backdrop for these precious pieces, for you all to enjoy!
