This is a lively and dynamic mixed media exhibition of seven emergina female painters, who have banded together to showcase their passion for colour.

Using a variety of mediums and techniques each artist has completed a body of work that best shows off

their love of colour. Ranging from 'blow-your-brain brilliant' to 'sobbinaly subtle', the works are complemented with matching styles and themes.

Pat Wyllie captures the feel and effects of light and colour in the Australian landscape and Doreen Constable paints sophisticated characters in stylish attire and surrounds.

In a contemporary naïve style, Vivien Bishop paints wheels in various quirky and colourful situations and Jill Araent explores the four seasons, using a hard line painting style in an abstract and minimal way.

Julie Lane and Pam Hailstone concentrate on the environment. but each in distinctive ways. Superb abstracts are created of the bark from various eucalypt trees and bold flowers are brought to life in structured compositions, using dramatic colours to emphasise 2D shapes. The works of Margaret Rothenberg link in with this theme, as she hones in on the stunning colour designs that decorate bugs and beetles as they interact with plants.

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ARTISTS OF THE MONTH

October: Julie Frahm Jewellery 1 - 31 October



'My main inspiration is glass, an amazing medium with endless possibilities. Using skills learned from various glass bead artists in Australia and the USA I have been creating Jewellery for many years and using glass beads since 2004.

For a couple of years now I have been using all sorts of "old" glass to make my beads. From beer and wine bottles to Depression Glass from the 1930's, I have had to learn all about the challenges of working with these materials, and the limitations it places on my work.

These challenges also make me feel like I am making a difference in the world, even if it only serves to make people stop for a moment and think about what they do with their old glass!

This showcase of my work allows me to try some other functional uses for glass beads. Decorative wine stoppers, bottle openers and cheese knives with beads made from recycled sources are included. Of course, there will be a variety of new glass bead jewellery to enjoy also!

I hope you enjoy my work.'

November: Katharina Urban Weavings 1 - 30 November

'My work in Australia began in 1959 when I travelled from Germany, having studied to become a master weaver. Since then I have had many opportunities to exhibit my work both in Adelaide and regionally.

I gained a Diploma of Fellowship with the Royal South Australian Society of Arts in 2005 after which I worked on some major tapestries in and around Adelaide. Two are on display in Parliament House, one in the University of South Australia, another in the Barossa Regional Gallery and more recently a completed community tapestry project in Lobethal.

To start a new work my designs are painted first with the aid of black & white 'cartoons' which are placed behind the warp. From there the new tapestry design can be developed. Special shades of colours are created by using several threads of different coloured wool on each bobbin, thus great subtlety and complexity within the design is achieved.



Just like mixing paint on a palette, weaving in this manner - starting from the bottom and moving to the top-requires good visualisation and organising skills, while still allowing room for improvisation. The latter is an important part of my creative process.


