



ARTISTS OF THE MONTH

February:

Paul MacDonald Ceramics

2 - 25 February



'I have been working with clay as an amateur ceramic artist over the last 40 years, and am largely self taught. Using a variety of stoneware and near-porcelain clays I work predominantly with the potter's wheel, being my preferred 'tool of the trade'.

I take influences from a mix of both European and Asian ceramic traditions and tend to focus on bowl and vessel forms rather than on sculptural statements.

My current work uses locally available materials yet reflects an exploration of certain glaze effects that originated in 12-13th century AD, China and Japan. Although frequently quite simple to mix, the glazes are highly complex and sensitive to kiln conditions. As a result they require much trial and error and careful control to master, but often retain an accidental quality which is very appealing. Such glazes look their best on simple shapes designed to harmonise with the extraordinary glaze colours and textures which adorn them.

I hope you enjoy my showcase.'

March:

David Ledden Pyrography 1 - 31 March

'Pyrography is defined as 'the art of using heat and/or fire to create an artistic form'.

Since the advent of fire, pyrography is the earliest decorative art form known to mankind. My illustrations are based on observations from nature, and influenced by my work in the Strzelecki Desert over the past twenty five years. There, nothing is permanent or static, providing me with an abundance of wildlife for my creativity to feed from.

My burning ambition to introduce this amazing art form to people of all ages has continued over the 35 years that I have studied, taught and exhibited it. I have also sought to 'lift the bar' of pyrography to a recognised art form. I was therefore thrilled when my entry into the Waterhouse Natural History Art Prize in 2008 was accepted. Titled 'Sanctuary', I received a Highly Commended Award and continued on to the National Archives of Australia in Canberra.



I hope you have the opportunity to appreciate the art form as much as I do.'
