Artists of the Month:

August **Rachel Hare -**Jewellery





"It all started with a box of laminate samples plonked on my desk in Edinburgh, Scotland with my boss saying "Can you make something with these Rachel?!"

I was the designer for a catering company; so I dusted off my toolbox, searched for my jewellers' saw and set about making canapé trays and mirrors to show potential clients.

Fast forward 10 years and I'm back in my home town of Adelaide launching Rarehare Designs - my jewellery and giftware label which embraces the use of recycled materials and in particular laminates. Off-cuts, discontinued samples, seconds and scrap yard finds; if its not wanted anymore I'll take it, work with it and re-invent it.

My latest range '70s Wood Revival' incorporates my love of the 70s and my passion for all things wooden. It's about combining vibrant colours, textures, patterns and woods to create the feeling of warmth in each piece. In turn I hope this transcends to the wearer.

Every piece of tiny laminate and every item of jewellery I make is carefully hand sawn and filed, creating unique and special mini works of art. It's intricate, fiddly work but I love it!

I hope you enjoy '70s Wood Revival' as much as I did in the creating!'

Yvonne Twining -Leatherwork

"My fascination with leather began in 1974 when everything was done with vegetable tanned cowhide. The leather could be carved or stamped before colouring and finishing, and then assembled. Edge laced or hand stitched were the most common forms of assembly.

The leather industry has moved forward in leaps and bounds and today we have a myriad of colours and surface patterns to tempt the senses. My emphasis is on the designs of my functional leather goods with attention to sound construction and finishing details. I offer a range of items from small tourist tempters which include references to Australian fauna in the design, through to large tote bags.

There is ongoing demand both locally and interstate for my teaching of lastless footwear and leather bags The footwear range is named 'lastless' as it is moulded to the individual shape of the wearer's feet, rather than a pre-made cast. This teaching aspect of my work makes for interesting trips away, and is a great way to share my craft.

The medium of leather is very satisfying to work with because it is both challenging and forgiving. Mistakes are creative opportunities.

I hope you enjoy my showcase."
