Joan Stratford Calligraphy and Steampunk Relief prints, wood



"As soon as I could hold a pencil my father, a railway design engineer, encouraged me to draw and foster a love of lettering. The many hours of drawing as a child eventually resulted in a career as an art teacher. Nearly 70 years down the track, I am still driven to producing art works, often involving calligraphy, and I am an active sale, along with a range of wood member of the Calligraphy Society of South Australia.

Now retired, I have the time and means to pursue and explore my artistic interests, including producing these cards and little books.

Recently, I was introduced to the fascinating world of 'Steampunk', an art genre named in the 70s which draws upon images, fashion and writing inspired by the industrial Victorian rise of steam power. Set in a future or alternate world, Steampunk provides unlimited potential for those with a fertile imagination. For an enthusiastic artist/ illustrator and calligrapher like me it is grist for the mill. I love it.

I transform pictures of silent movie stars, early naughty French postcards, and a host of other images as well as birds, insects and people, to the amusement of myself and others. I incorporate my calligraphy in many of these works as well as the use of ink and gouache, photomontage and collage effects. I have exhibited at many calligraphy exhibitions, but this is my first solo attempt, albeit a small one. It's a beginning: a valve has opened and it's full steam ahead."

"I started my art practice as a children's book illustrator in the UK, where I studied illustration and printmaking. I now concentrate mainly on producing handmade prints, and also enjoy teaching drawing and printmaking at art centres and for community groups.

My work has found its way into private collections in the UK, Europe, Canada, the USA and Japan as well as all over Australia. I write poetry as well, and sometimes combine words with the images that evolve out of my printmaking and drawing.

As part of the artist of the month display I will showcase my illustrated poetry book A Disastrous Honeymoon, the 'sequel' to Edward Lear's Owl and the Pussycat. Copies will be for engravings, relief prints and solarplate etchings featuring the adventures of a pair of romantic rabbits, a small black dog and some aerobatic pigs.

My Drawing for the Terrified workshops, which are a part of the Pepper Street workshop program, aim to help people relax as well as gain confidence in drawing. I hope you enjoy my display."
